Coro is very excited to introduce you to The Campaign for College Opportunity, a wonderful new organization that is sharing office space with us at 811 Wilshire Boulevard. The Campaign is a new California non profit that was created to address the access crisis facing higher education in the State of California due to the huge population growth of 18-24 year olds (called Tidal Wave II) that is occurring between 2003 and 2015. In essence, unless our state policy makers act, there is a very real possibility that over 1.8 million eligible Californians will be turned away from community colleges, Cal State Universities, and UC's. Our sole focus is addressing this issue. Specifically, this issue is critical for low income and communities of color who compose a significant proportion of "tidal wave II."
